RESTORING CIVIL RIGHTS AND/OR SETTING ASIDE A JUDGMENT (COVERSHEET)

You can use this packet if the following is true:

You want your Civil Rights Restored and/or your Judgment Set Aside.

For Restoring Civil Rights:

- You were sentenced for a felony in:
 - Mohave County Superior Court, OR
 - Federal Court and you live in Mohave County, AND
- You were discharged from:
 - prison, at least two (2) years ago, OR
 - **probation for criminal offense** (A.R.S § 13-907), on fulfillment of the conditions of probation or sentence and discharge by the Court, OR
 - probation for federal offense:
 - convicted for dangerous offense (A.R.S. §13-704), you may not file for the restoration of the right to possess or carry a gun or firearm.
 - convicted for serious offense (A.R.S. §13-706), a person may not file for restoration of the right to possess or carry a gun or firearm for ten years from the date of discharge from probation.
 - convicted of any other felony offense, the person may not file for the restoration of his right to possess or carry a gun or firearm for two years from the date of his discharge from probation.

For Having a Judgment Set Aside:

- You were sentenced for a criminal offense in Mohave County Superior Court, AND/OR
- You were discharged from probation or prison

IMPORTANT: Criminal records cannot be expunged. (A.R.S. §13.907)

NOTE: It is very important for you to know that when you sign a court document, you may be helping or hurting your court case. Before you sign any court document, or get involved with a court case, it is important that you see a lawyer to make sure you are doing the right thing.
